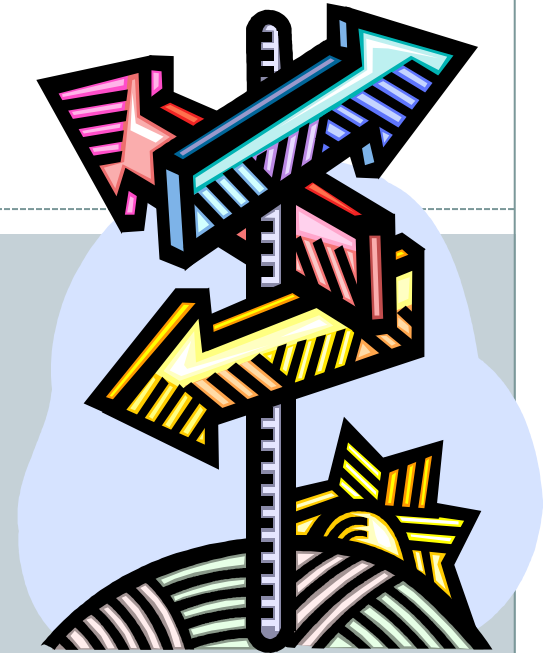

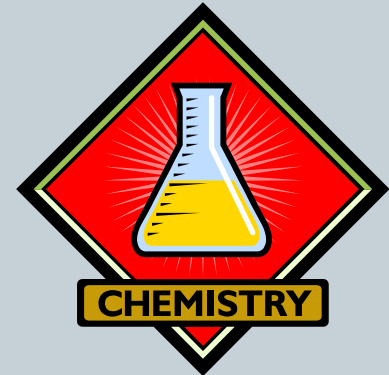

# Subject Choice - Examined Subjects

- You will take 7 subjects unless you have an exemption from one
- You will choose 4 subjects as well as English, Irish and Maths
- LCVP is taken as an 8<sup>th</sup> subject if you are eligible for it



# Leaving Cert Established

- NOTE: History and Geography are mandatory for JC but optional for Leaving Cert

# LCVP



- What is it?
  - An add on programme where you study two modules namely Enterprise Education and The world of Work. It aims to prepare young people for both.
- How do I get it?
  - By having the correct combination of subjects
- Why is it a good idea?
  - If you do any ordinary level subjects it is very useful for points
  - It is common level
  - It is assessed completely before the LC
  - 60% portfolio including items like CV, Career Investigation, Recorded Interview, visits
  - 40% Exam in May of LC Year

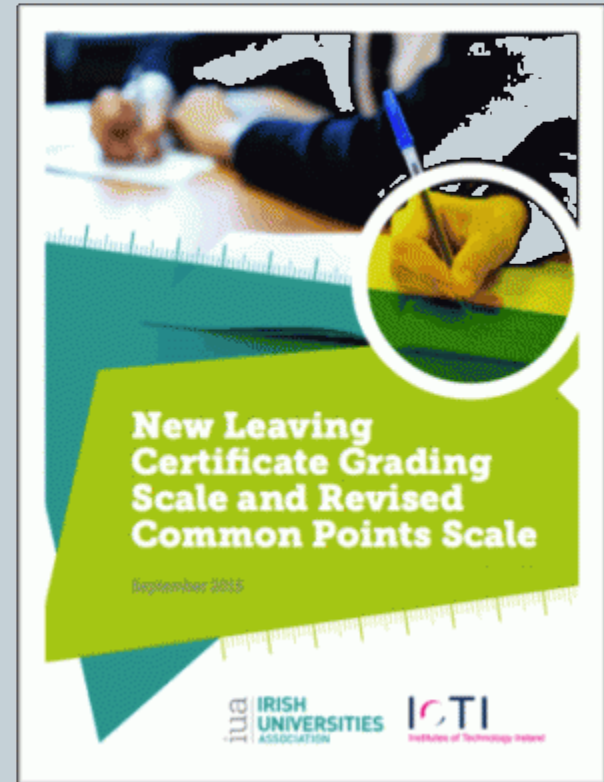

# Points

- **Six best subjects**
- **All worth the same except:**
  - **H.L. Maths**
  - **LCVP**





# Points



- Points are allocated for the six best grades
- Points must be achieved in one sitting of the Leaving Certificate
- Entry to a course will be granted to those who have highest points
- Colleges do not set the points rather the number of places → supply & demand
- The points reflect the results of the students and the number of places available in the college in that year

# Maths



- 25 bonus points will continue to be awarded for Higher Level Mathematics for H6 grades (40%) and above.
- Foundation Level Mathematics: Universities do not award points for Foundation Level. Be very careful with Foundation Level as it is only accepted for a few courses.

## AWARDS IN THE FRAMEWORK

There are four classes of award in the National Framework of Qualifications:



- Major Awards:** named in the outer rings, are the principal class of awards made at a level
- Minor Awards:** are for partial completion of the outcomes for a Major Award
- Supplemental Awards:** are for learning that is additional to a Major Award
- Special Purpose Awards:** are for relatively narrow or purpose-specific achievement

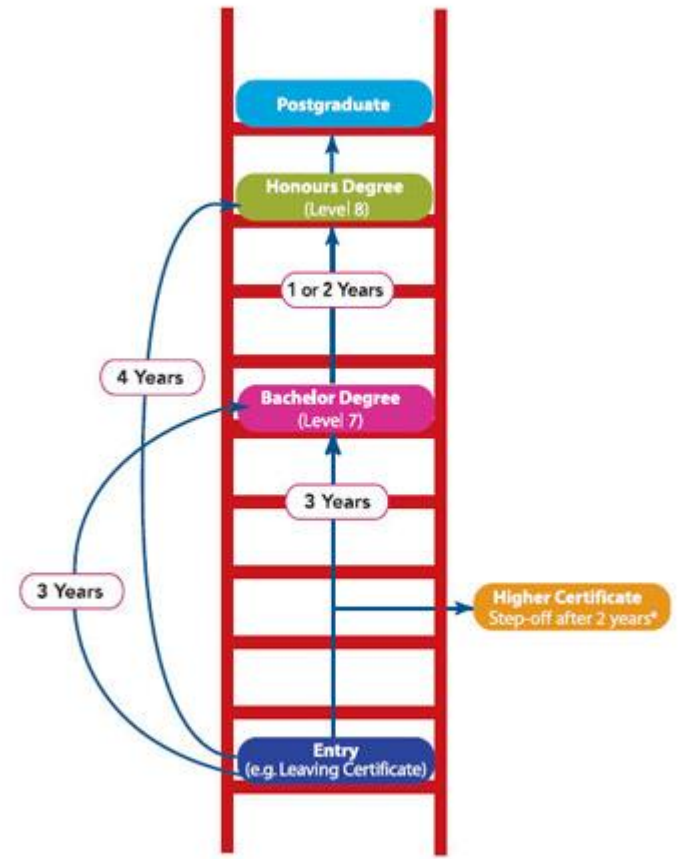

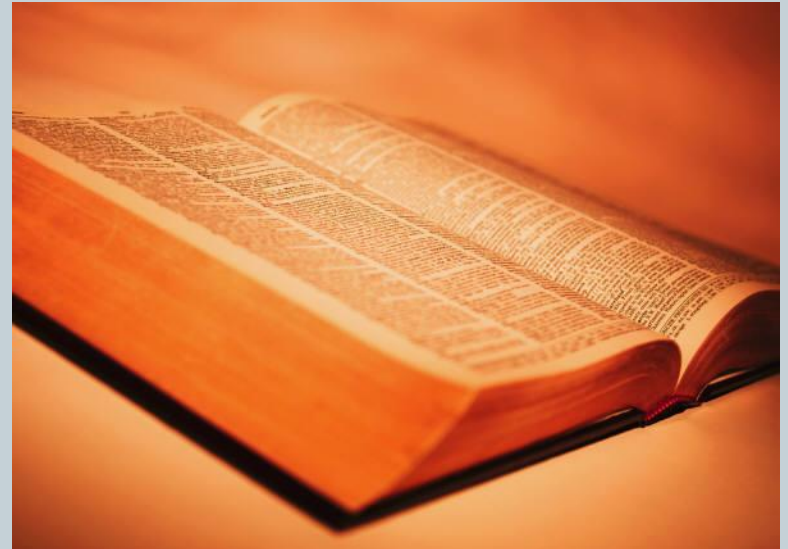

# General Entry Requirements

- Be careful with Foundation Level
- Think carefully about levels as this affects Entry Requirements



# Specific Subject Requirements

- It is important to realise that choosing your subject options for the Leaving Certificate is different from choosing your career.
- Required subjects Vs Helpful subjects





# Required or Helpful? Assumptions...

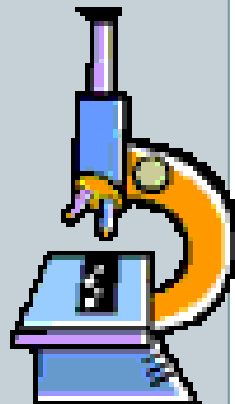


- For example
- you don't have to do Engineering in the Leaving Certificate to become an engineer but it will be helpful. However Honours Maths and Physics are very helpful. (and often essential)

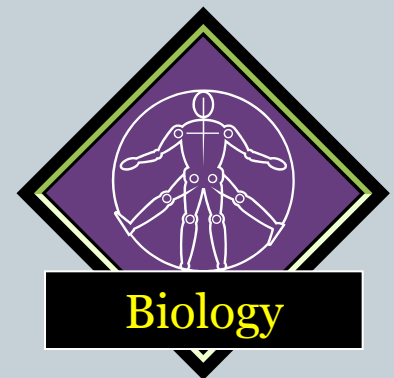
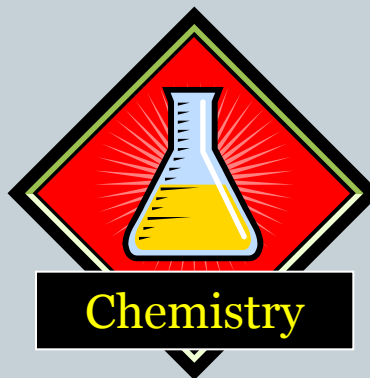
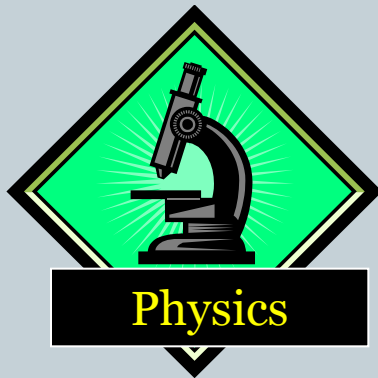
A decision to drop all **science** subjects or **foreign languages** will have significant implications on the range of courses/careers open to you later on.



# WHY?



- If you are considering Medical, Paramedical, Nursing, Science or Engineering courses you should select a laboratory science subject or two for some courses



# Languages



- Approximately 10% of all CAO courses require a language other than Irish and English.
- Limerick colleges do not require a third language unless it is part of the course of study.
- On [www.qualifax.ie](http://www.qualifax.ie) you can see the implications of not doing a language
- Mostly arts and humanities courses require a third language. Note: Medicine, PE in UCC, Shannon College of Hotel Management, Home economics teaching, Architecture in UCD, Speech Therapy also require a language.
- NUI Colleges: UCD, MU, NUIG, UCC, RCSI, SCHM, NCAD, ST. ANGELAS, MILLTOWN INSTITUTE, Institute of Public Administration, University.
- Moral of the story → CHECK!

# Languages



A Pass in a European Language is required for entry to many courses in NUI colleges. The main exceptions are

- ✦ NCAD which will accept Art instead of a language
- ✦ Some Science, Nursing and Engineering courses

○ UL, Trinity, DCU, DIT and all Institutes of Technology require either:

- ✦ English and Maths
- ✦ English, Maths and ANOTHER language which can be Irish
- ✦ Irish Exemptions carry through if OFFICIAL exemptions
- ✦ Gardaí, Army cadetships, Primary Teaching → exemptions do not apply

# Basic Entry Requirements: Languages

College	Subjects Required
NUI Colleges	English, Irish, and a third Language for some courses
Trinity	English, Maths and another Language
UL	English, Maths and another language
DCU	Maths & English or Irish
I.T's	Maths & English or Irish
Others	Vary



# Specific Subject Requirements



- Science: One or two science subjects depending on the course or university. Biology, Chemistry, Physics or Ag. Science (sometimes accept Maths or Applied Maths)
- Engineering: Honours Maths for Universities (Special Maths exam)
- Primary Teaching: H5 in Higher Level Irish
- Veterinary Medicine /Dietetics/Pharmacy/Dentistry: **Chemistry**
- Medicine: HPAT + Chemistry + one science depending on location
- Art: Portfolio and Art or Language or soon DCG
- Trinity: Paramedical/science → 2 Science Subjects

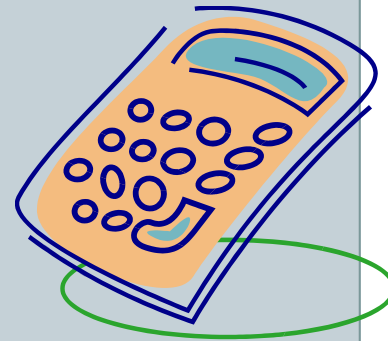
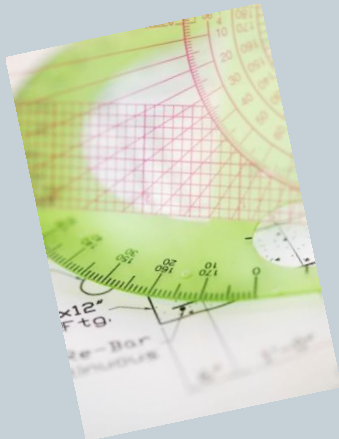
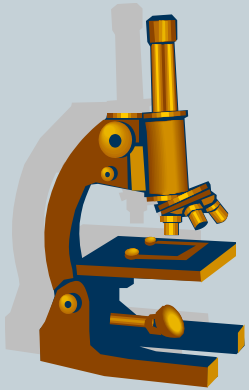

## Consider the following factors when choosing your subjects:

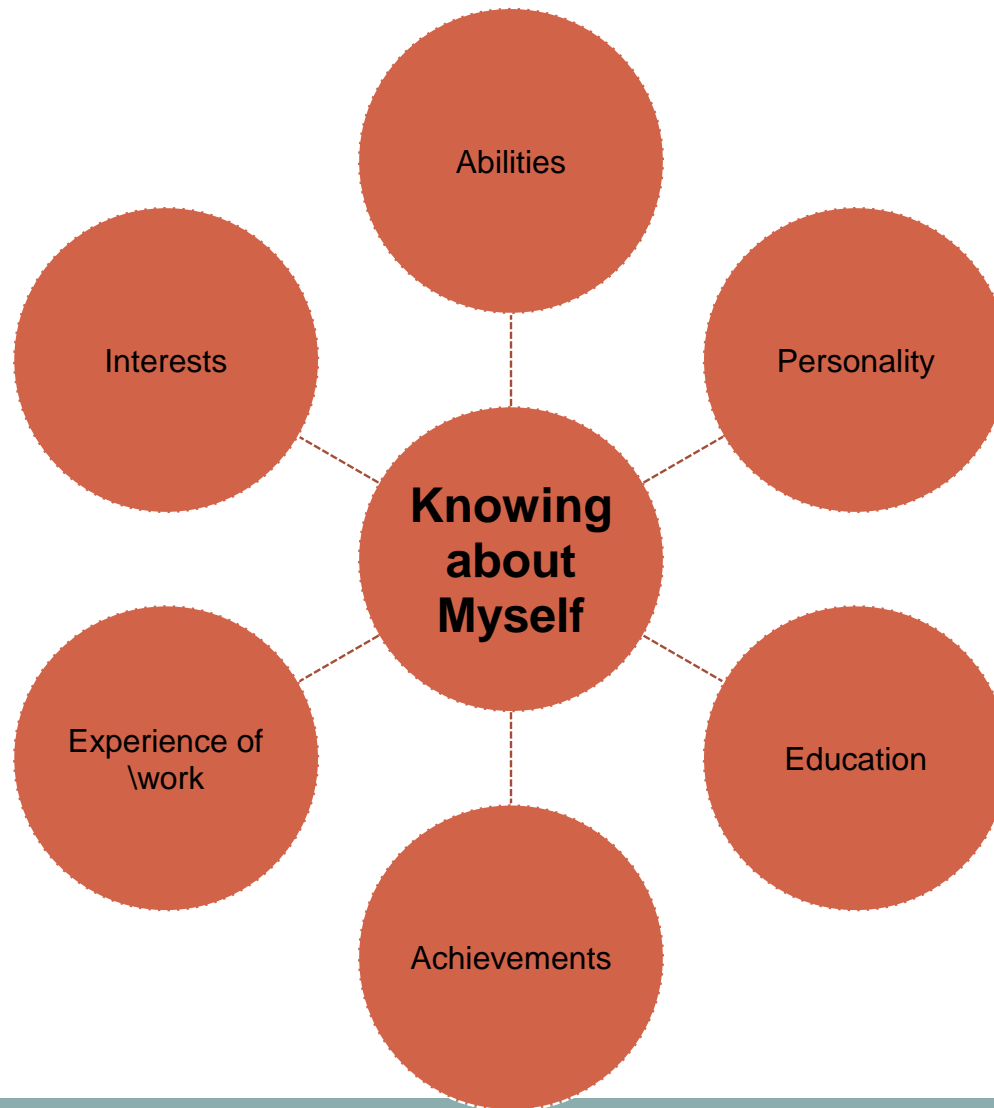
- ▶ **ABILITY** - choose subjects in which you are likely to get good grades.

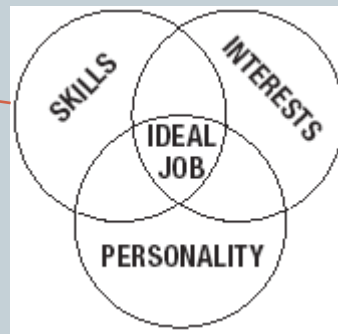

# Final words....

- Do your research
- Different colleges can have different requirements for the same course

## Note the following:



- Numbers for particular classes may be limited e.g practical subjects 20/24 max
- In so far as possible students will be given their subject choice
- It is very important when choosing the subjects to put them in order of preference
- You must complete form from 1-6
- Do not choose subjects that you have not sat for your Junior Cert unless you have spoken to the relevant teacher AND had them sign on the form that they are happy to take you on.

- The **Transition Year (TY)** is a one-year programme designed to act as a bridge between the Junior Certificate and Leaving Certificate programmes.
- Each school designs its own Transition Year programme, within set guidelines, to suit the needs and interests of its students.
- The school promotes the personal, social, vocational and educational development of students.

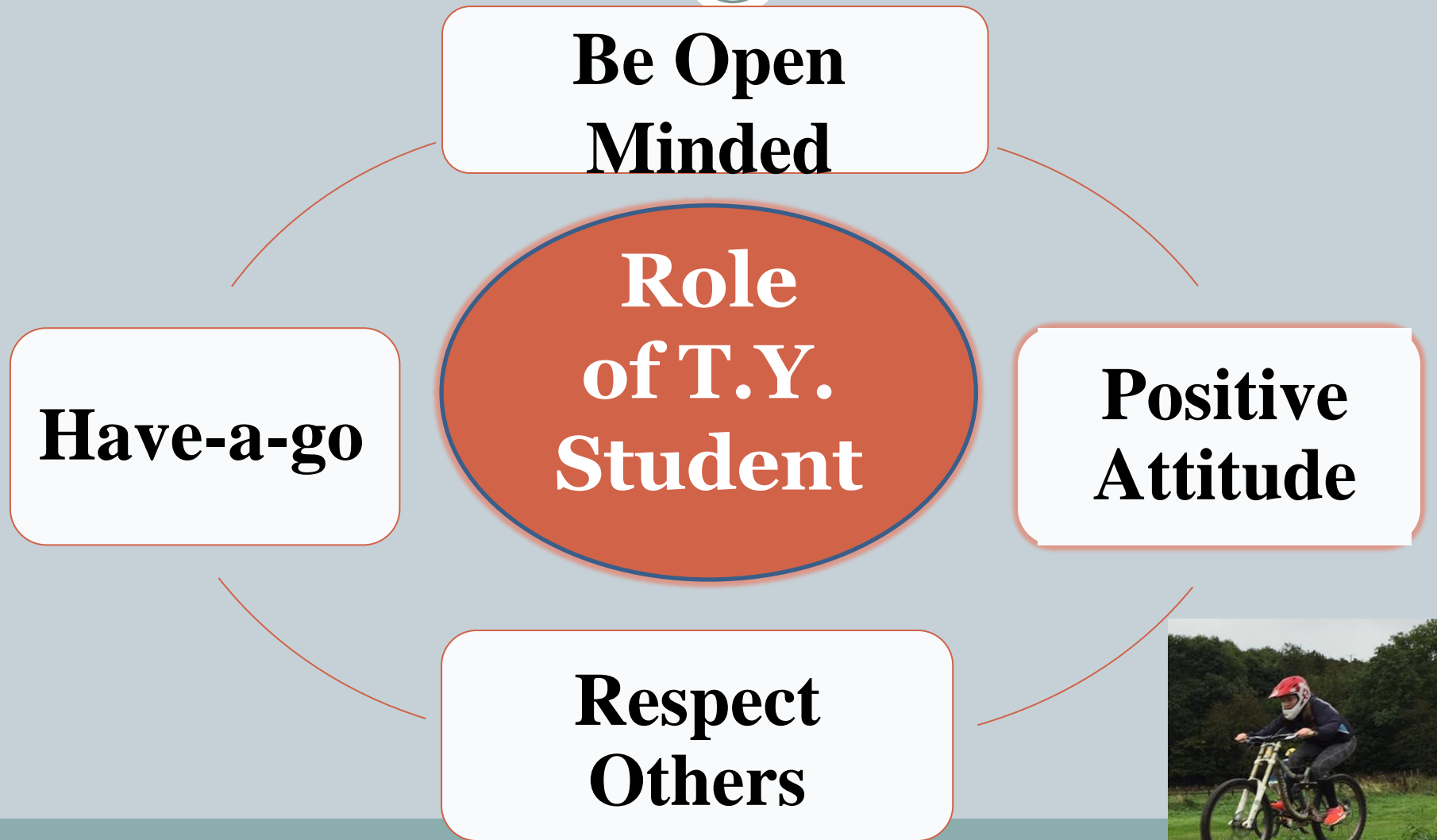

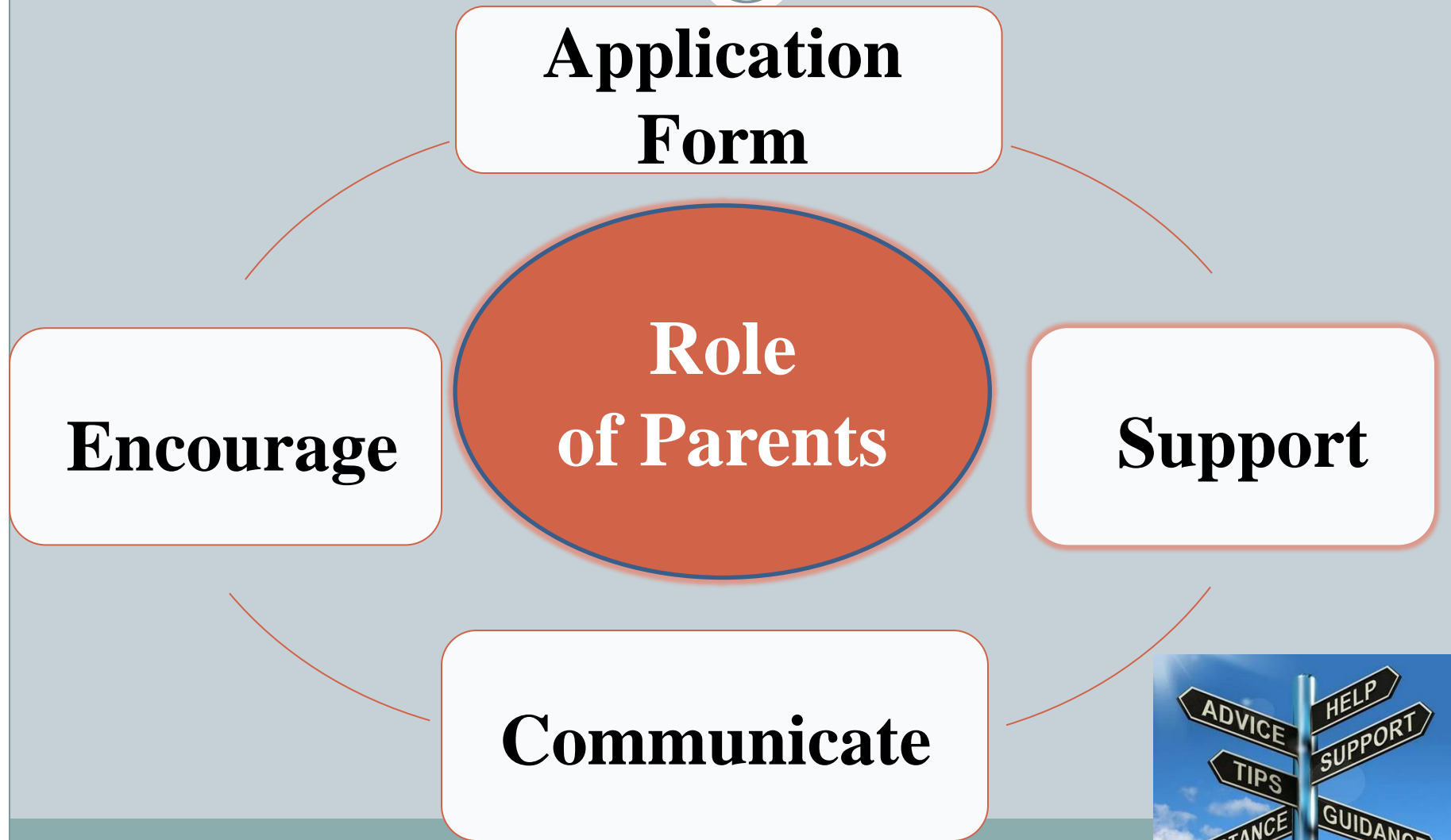

# Transition Year Programme

## Assessment

Student assessments are carried out on an ongoing basis:

- Group work, Presentations, written exam, etc
- Participation in class, project work, social work, group work, work experience etc.
- Students are awarded a Certificate for Transition year with either a Pass, Merit or Distinction

## Criteria for selection into Transition Year includes the following:

- Satisfactory completion of the application form
- Have completed third year
- Have a proven commitment to good behaviour, hard work, attendance, punctuality and study
- Be committed to applying him/herself to Transition Year and to what it has to offer (e.g. to co-operate and participate in all events)

# Expectations

- Transition year in St. Anne's is an exciting but demanding year. You will get out of TY what you put into it.
- We expect students to **volunteer** for the many projects and opportunities available which can take place both during and outside school time.
- We expect students to be in classes with and work with different people to develop their team work and social skills.
- We expect students to continue to **maintain high standards** of academic work and be responsible for their own learning.
- We provide the opportunity for students to engage in a different style of learning and different forms of assignments and homework.

# TY FEES

- A deposit of €100 (either cash or cheque payable to LCETB) with this application

AND

- Either a single payment of €350 OR €150 in April, €100 in May and €100 in June 2017.
