FACILITIES

St. Anne's Community College, Killaloe, is a very modern co-educational post primary school which was completed in 1987. The present buildings replaced the old St. Anne's Secondary School on Convent Hill which had been providing secondary education since 1945.

St. Anne's Community College stands on a fifteen acre site in Clarisford which was purchased by the Parents Council in 1978. The school is ideally located in a quiet rural area, providing a suitable tranquil environment, conducive to study and education.

Since opening in 1987, the school at Clarisford has expanded several times due to an increasing enrolment. A new wing was added in 2002 and a major extension was completed in August 2019.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES


A wide range of extra-curricular activities are available at St. Anne's. The following school teams compete in Clare and Munster competitions.

UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS

Boys & Girls: Navy crested uniform jacket available from the school

Girls:

- Navy ankle length skirt or navy straight legged pants. Navy jeans/cords, track suit pants or hipsters are **not** acceptable
- Navy V-necked school jumper with St. Anne's crest
- Light blue blouse
- School tie
- Navy socks or tights
- Brown, black or navy shoes. Runners with non-scuff soles are acceptable provided that they are <u>completely</u> black, brown or navy. Boots/Converse and similar types of footwear are not acceptable. Light canvas shoes are unsuitable for inclement weather conditions.

Boys:

- Dark Grey pants straight legged, full length
- Navy V-necked school jumper with St. Anne's crest
- Light blue shirt
- School tie
- Navy/grey socks
- Brown, black or navy shoes. Runners with non-scuff soles are acceptable provided that they are **completely** black, brown or navy. Boots/Converse and similar types of footwear are not acceptable. Light canvas shoes are unsuitable for inclement weather conditions.

PASTORAL AND ACADEMIC SUPPORT

In order to ensure a caring and orderly environment the following structures are in place:

- Class Tutors
- Year Heads
- Deputy Principal
- Principal

In addition, students are supported by:

- **Chaplain:** Maintains personal contact with individual students, staff and parents throughout their school journey, while promoting physical, emotional and spiritual wellbeing. The Chaplain arranges for, and organizes school celebrations in a multi denominational fashion throughout the year.
- **Two Guidance Counsellors**: advise students on career choices and assist pupils in making educational, vocational and personal decisions. The Guidance Counsellors also support and help pupils who are experiencing difficulty in their lives.
- Learning Support Teachers: Identify pupils with special educational needs, organize appropriate interventions, apply for accommodations in state exams and advise the Principal on timetabling of additional support.

Further Supports Include:

- Mentors: Senior students who have been trained to assist first year pupils in their transition from primary to secondary school.
- Supervised Study: Is available to all students. It runs Monday to Thursday (inclusive) from 4:05pm to 6:05pm and 6:35pm to 8:30pm. It also runs from 2:00pm to 4:00pm on Fridays. After school study for 1st & 2nd Years operates Monday to Thursday from 4.05pm to 5.30pm.
- The Student Council: This gives students an opportunity to express themselves and communicate their concerns. The student council is consulted in areas such as policy development.
- **The School Journal:** In addition to being used for recording homework it is a valuable means of communication between home and school. Parents/guardians sign the journal weekly and the class tutor countersigns it.
- The '*Text a Parent*' Facility: This facility has greatly improved communication with parents/guardians. It is used in addition to letters, reports, newsletters, phone calls, parent teacher meetings and other meetings as required.
- Way2Pay: Our cashless payment system. Parents can make payments by text instantly on their

smartphones, in instalments.

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
