Sailing: TY2 participated in water activities in the UL Activity Centre. The students tried sailing, supping, and rock climbing.




Ennis Book Club: A select group of TY students participated in a virtual book club. Students read novels by Sarah Moore and were given the opportunity to converse with the author.
