

Transition Year is a one year programme designed to bridge the gap between the Junior and Leaving Certificate programmes.

#### Transition Year Programme



Each School designs its own Transition Year programme within set guidelines, to suit the needs and interests of its students.



The school promotes the personal, social, vocational and academic development of the student.



Education for Maturity, with emphasis on awareness of the relationships with peers leading to an increase in social confidence.

#### Transition Year Elements



Education through experience of **adult working life** as a basis for personal development and maturity.



Development of interpersonal, technical and academic skills with an emphasis on self-directed learning.

#### Transition Year Aims



To enable students to take more responsibility for their own learning and decision making.



To help students to develop a range of transferrable critical thinking and creative problem solving skills.



To promote **student voice** in recognizing their capabilities and welcome their opinion and contribution to society.



To Provide the opportunity to acquire the **coping and resilience skills** necessary for modern society.



To enable students to focus on their individual and group wellbeing.



To provide students with opportunities to **reflect on** and evaluate their learning.







#### Assessment



Student assessments are carried out on an ongoing basis.

Accumlative grade average allows students to reflect on their own learning and take responsibility for it.



Participation on Work Placement.



Students are awarded a certificate for Transition Year with either a Pass, Merit or Distinction.

#### Criteria for Selection

Satisfactory completion of the application form including deposit by specified date.

Student has completed third year.

Have a proven commitment to good behaviour, hard work, attendance, punctuality and study.

Be committed to applying him/herself to Transition Year and to what it has to offer by participating in all events.



### What next?



Complete the online application form with your son/daughter. Submit by Tuesday 21st February 2023.



Ensure to enter the names of 4 friends. We will endeavor to place your son/daughter in a class group with one friend.



We will contact you by email. When completing the form, please enter an email address which you access regularly.



Once your son/daughter has been accepted on to the programme, pay the TY fee deposit of €100.

# TY FEES — Total €500 + €50 Student Contribution Fee

A deposit of €100 to be paid when your son/daughter is accepted on to the programme. You will be sent a Way2Pay link with your notification.

#### AND

Either a single payment of €400 OR €100 by 28th February, €100 by 31st March and €100 by 30th April and €100 by 31st May 2023.

All payments to be made online on our Way2Pay System. Click on the Parent Tab on our website www.killaloecc.ie for more details.

All fees must be paid by Wednesday 31st May 2023.

Students will be allocated to class groups after 31<sup>st</sup> May, once the fee has been paid in full.

#### FEES

The TY fee will include most costs but there may be some additional costs which may arise throughout the year.

Non-payment of the full fee will lead to your child being withdrawn from the TY programme.




